Project
Refurbishment and conversion
of Grade II Listed church into a
performance venue

OVERVIEW

Pellings were appointed to co-ordinate the £7m conversion and refurbishment of a Grade II Listed church to an exhibition and concert venue on behalf of the Cadogan Estate. The Hall, which features state of the art performance technology, has become the permanent home of the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra.

The role of Pellings accredited conservation building surveyor was important in specifying and monitoring the external repair elements of the project.

The cleaning and repair of the Portland limestone elevations have transformed the building into a gleaming white landmark again. A new copper roof was installed to mirror the original which was damaged in the Second World War.

Whilst the original character has been retained, new facilities such as green rooms, dressing rooms, a music archive and a crush bar have been created. The auditorium also benefits from a new stage and new seating.

Finely tuned acoustics were crucial to the very specialist nature of the building's new use. This was facilitated through installation of tuned resonator tubes.
